



The Honorable Clim Davenport

The "Big Mason" of Georgia



The Most Worshipful Smooth Ashlar Grand Lodge of Georgia Free and Accepted Ancient York Masons Prince Hall Origin National Compact Jurisdiction of Georgia is a jurisdiction under the Most Worshipful National Grand Lodge that shares a warm and robust history and likes to profess that it is one of the touch bearing jurisdictions in the Compact. The Most Worshipful Smooth Ashlar Grand Lodge could in no way be what it projects with out the leadership of one of her best leaders. That leader was the Honorable Clim Davenport. Past Master Davenport "The Big Mason", as he was called in the Compact was the longest serving Grand Master of the Most Worshipful Smooth Ashlar Grand Lodge and did so much to leave an indelible legacy and enormous shoes to fill.


The Honorable Clim Davenport was raised a Master Mason in Westside Lodge No. 420 in Atlanta, Georgia. On May 17th 1940. According to Past Grand Senior Warden Donald "Pops" Summerlin, who was raised by Clim Davenport in 1947, Clim

Davenport was a successful neighborhood Grocery Store owner. A warrant was granted to Royal Ark Lodge No. 574 by Past Grand Master the honorable Dr. Lyndon Marcus Hill and Clim Davenport served as the first Worshipful Master. He was elected Right Worshipful Deputy Grand Master of Smooth Aslar Grand Lodge in 1943. He organized Royal Arch Chapter No. 11 and Royal Commandery No. 4 Knights Templar in 1945. The Honorable Clim Davenport was elected Grand Master in 1947. Also in 1947, the Honorable Clim Davenport helped to organize the Neziah Grand Temple of the Ancient Arabic Order of Nobles of the Mystic Shrine. The Temple was warranted by the Imperial Council in 1948 and Clim Davenport served as its first Grand Potentate. In 1956, he established the Clim Davenport College Scholarship Awards for Graduating high school seniors whose parents were members of the Order. He was elevated to the office of National Deputy Grand Master in 1963.

A LEGACY ETCHED IN GRANITE

No man nor Mason who travels the state of Georgia and has the blessing to visit many of the African American churches, can deny, if they pay attention to the Cornerstones laid at many of these are in fact laid by Grand Master Clim Davenport. There is a old wives tale here in Georgia that only Smooth Ashlar Grand Lodge Yorkrite Masons are the only ones allowed to lay cornerstones. Our brothers of the Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Georgia take exception to this. However, one could easily see, through traveling through the state, that Clim Davenport has probably laid more cornerstones during his administration that all that have been laid by the Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Georgia. The legacy of Clim Davenport is etched in granite in the vast number of cornerstones laid during his administration. The following are just a small sample of the many laid under the auspices of the Most Worshipful Smooth Grand Lodge.

Smooth Ashlar Grand Lodge Cornerstones laid under the administration of Clim Davenport
















The Honorable Clim Davenport passed away on May 8, 1974 and was laid to rest at Southview Cemetery in Southeast Atlanta, Georgia. Grand Master Davenport left a lasting impression on York Masonry in the state of Georgia as well as the National Compact. He was the hero and champion of enterprise. He was the template of Faith, Hope and Charity through his work. It is hard to mention the Most Worshipful Smooth Ashlar Grand Lodge and talk about its history and legacy and not mention the name Clem Davenport, Grand Master of Masons.



Address of Grand Master Clim Davenport

At the Grand Lodge Session of
The Most Worshipful Smooth Ashlar Grand Lodge
Dublin, Georgia
September 23-26, 1962

It gives me rare pleasure to you upon this most auspicious occasion, to be permitted to look into your faces, and to hope that our fellowship, for the few days we shall deliberate together, will be characterized by good-will, brotherly love and affection.

By the all-wise providence of God, we have been permitted to assemble ourselves together on the 97th Annual Communication to review the work of Craftsmen during the past year, and lay plans for the carrying forward, successfully, the work of the Order in the future. The very fact that so many of us who were present One Year ago are present now and see each other face to face, is an evidence of God's goodness and tender mercies towards us, and is sufficient cause for Thanksgiving.

While we have been spared, scores of our Brother Master Masons throughout the jurisdiction have been summoned to lay down their working tools and to appear before the Grand Master of the Universe to give an account of their stewartship here below. The further fact that we are all subject to this summon.

Sooner or later, should constrain us all to be good and true Master Masons.

Permit me to say, in this connection, that the kind of Order we shall have in the future will be determined, largely by the kind of men out of which the Order is built. If the Order be built of men who are good and true, we shall have an Order that is good and sustainable. If our men, for the most part, are honest, truthful and law abiding, our Fraternity will stand fro Law and Order. If, on the other hand, we be men who are inclined to acts of dishonesty, and who do not regard Law and Order, our Fraternity will take likeness after these kind of men.

Brethren, we must over keep in mind the fact the supreme purpose of Masonry is the building of Moral Character and that the monetary side of Masonry is more adjunct. If we succeed in building up a great financial institution at the expense of Moral Worth, we will have greatly over-shot the mark of Masonry. Therefore, I urge you Worshipful Masters to stress the Moral Development of your men. Teach this by your own personal example, even more than by precept.

Let us dedicate our Order more fully to the work of Moral Uplift among our fellowmen, but more, especially, among the brethren of the Craft. While I emphasize the necessity of developing the Moral side of our Brothers, the nature of our Order makes it very necessary that we build stronger and stronger our financial side. For as we grow numerically, our financial obligations increase proportionately, obligations that must be met as long as we stay solvent.

We can only remain solvent so long as our income is sufficient to meet our current and outstanding obligations. These outstanding and ever increasing obligations in the nature of Death Claims, which are incident to the mortality of the human family cannot be checked not regulated by human power and skill, but human minds and power must provide the necessary income to meet these obligations when they come due. And to make wise and adequate provision. Out entire membership throughout the jurisdiction must fully and promptly co-operate with the Grand Lodge Officers in their efforts to meet these obligations and therby discharge the duties you yourselves have assigned to them. Permit me to say further that the Grand Charity Fund that was instituted and held in trust for the specific and exclusive payment of Death Claims of the Brethren as they fall by the way from time to time; and cannot legally be used for any other purpose. The property valued at more than \$300,000, we own, is a mere security on every Policy issued by the Order, and, under the Law, is held for the payment of these policies. Therefore, the purport of the Grand Charity Fund and the property we own, are one and insecurable, as I view it. That being true, our membership is just as much bound to support the one as the other, and the call for money to support one is just as mandatory upon the membership as a call to support the other.

I have been asked repeatedly, at meetings where I addressed the brethren, why I did not discuss Religious Organizations. My judgement is that we need have little fear of the enemy on the outside, if we properly concern ourselves about the enemy on the inside. The biggest problem before us is not a question of numbers, of wealth, of fine Temples, or perfection in the work. What Masonry needs today is MEN; real men, men of vision, men of unselfishness, both of mind and body. If we measure our applicants by these standards, we need have no fear of the future. We must get back to the fundamental principles of our Ancient Time-honored institution, that we may be able to transmit to posterity the heritage which has been placed in our keeping.

Although the growth has not been as large this year as for several years preceeding, I deem this a healthy condition. We have been, in the last few years, growing with abnormal rapidity. Too many are knocking at our doors and gaining admission to out Lodges who have but a faint conception of the real purpose of Freemasonry.

The laying of cornerstones offers a most splendid opportunity for impressing the public with the importance of our institution. The ceremonies for such occasion are the most beautiful and profound. Therefore, I suggest that the subordinate Lodges encourage Building Committees in your Districts to have you lay Cornerstones for them when they are erecting a New Building. Remember however, that it is only the prerogative of the Grand Lodge to lay Cornerstones. Therefore, always send a written request to the Grand Master for permission to do this kind of Masonic Work, so that you get proper instruction.

It has been a great pleasure to me to have served you in the capacity of Grand Master. The office affords me splendid opportunities to serve the needs of our people and to give much needed instruction to them. Their believe in the power of the Grand Master to solve so many of their difficult problems and to remove the cause of so many of their troubles strikes the chords of deepest sympathy.

I have striven hard to render satisfactory service and if I have made mistakes that merit criticism; if I have done wrong in any connection; and have gien the cause for offense to anyone; I have done it in an effort to do what I thought at the time was best and right. I am sure when you have time to reflect, you will exercise charity towards me that all Masons are taught to have towards one another, since we all human and knowing that it is human to err.

I wish to again thank you for the confidence you placed in me One Year ago by bestowing the highest honor you can bestow.

I ray God's choicest blessings on each of you, my Brethren, while here and his special love and protection of our loved Ones at home, during our absence.
